INTROIT

The holy gospel is written in the twelfth chapter of the gospel according to St John, beginning at the twentieth verse.

Now among those who went up to worship at the festival were some Greeks. They came to Philip, who was from Bethsaida in Galilee, and said to him, 'Sir, we wish to see Jesus.' Philip went and told Andrew; then Andrew and Philip went and told Jesus. Jesus answered them, 'The hour has come for the Son of Man to be glorified. Very truly, I tell you, unless a grain of wheat falls into the earth and dies, it remains just a single grain; but if it dies, it bears much fruit. Those who love their life lose it, and those who hate their life in this world will keep it for eternal life. Whoever serves me must follow me, and where I am, there will my servant be also. Cash, coins & cheques

Simply place your donation in one of the collection plates used during services, or in the wall safe in the Narthex by the main door.

If you're a UK tax-payer we can claim 25% of the value of your donation from His Majesty's Government in GiftAid. Simply place your donation in one of the yellow gift envelopes marked 'All Saints' Church'. Please ensure you fill in all the boxes on the envelope, otherwise it'll make it difficult to fully process your donation.

Chip & pin or Contactless

You can donate to us using the Giving Station at the back of the Nave. Simply follow the steps on screen to select your amount, and use your contactless debit or credit card, or ApplePay or Google Pay compatible device to complete the transaction.

If you're a UK tax-payer you can tell us through the Giving Station, and we'll be able to claim a further 25% of the value of your donation.

Direct Giving by Standing Order

We're grateful for all donations, but if you'd like to make a regular donation you can complete a standing order form so that each week, month or year, your donation can be automatically processed by your bank. Please speak to a sidesperson, who will provide you with the relevant form and GiftAid declaration.

Giving via your mobile device
