# Readings and Prayers for Today

#### **INTROIT**

Proclaim a joyful sound and let it be heard; proclaim to the ends of the earth: The Lord has freed his people, alleluia.

#### **COLLECT**

God our redeemer, who hast delivered us from the power of darkness and brought us into the kingdom of thy Son: grant, that as by his death he hath recalled us to life, so by his continual presence in us he may raise us to eternal joy; through Jesus Christ thy Son our Lord, who liveth and reigneth with thee, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever.

First Reading Acts 10.44-48

A reading from the Acts of the Apostles.

While Peter was still speaking, the Holy Spirit fell upon all who heard the word. The circumcised believers who had come with Peter were astounded that the gift of the Holy Spirit had been poured out even on the Gentiles, for they heard them speaking in tongues and extolling God. Then Peter said, 'Can anyone withhold the water for baptizing these people who have received the Holy Spirit just as we have?' So he ordered them to be baptized in the name of Jesus Christ. Then they invited him to stay for several days.

I do not call you servants any longer, because the servant does not know what the master is doing; but I have called you friends, because I have made known to you everything that I have heard from my Father. 

Today is the **Sixth Sunday of Easter**, also known as **Rogation Sunday**. The name is derived from the Latin word *rogare* or 'to ask' as we pray God's blessing upon what has been planted, in hope for deliverance from disasters and a rich and nourishing harvest. As well as praying for our parish, we pray particularly for those involved in agriculture during this complicated weather.

Please speak to God and not to each other before worship begins. Please help us maintain an atmosphere of prayerful quiet as the church is made ready for worship.

There will be **free coffee and biscuits** available to the congregation after the 10.30 Choral Eucharist on the first Sunday of each month. Our thanks to the Bistro and our churchwardens for making this possible.

Our collections for **Castle Hill Church Foodbank** continue; thank you for your continuing generosity. They especially request children's cereals, long life milk, brown & white long grain rice and microwavable food (non-perishable). Thank you to Kim Zambo for transporting your donations.

Deanery Synod meets next on 12<sup>th</sup> June 2024. As we prepare for the Annual Parochial Church Meeting (which takes place on Sunday 26<sup>th</sup> May 2024) please consider, during this festive period, whether you could support and serve our community by offering yourself as a PCC member or Deanery Synod member.

# Cash, coins & cheques

Simply place your donation in one of the collection plates used during services, or in the wall safe in the Narthex by the main door.

If you're a UK tax-payer we can claim 25% of the value of your donation from His Majesty's Government in GiftAid. Simply place your donation in one of the yellow gift envelopes marked 'All Saints' Church'. Please ensure you fill in all the boxes on the envelope, otherwise it'll make it difficult to fully process your donation.

# Chip & pin or Contactless

You can donate to us using the Giving Station at the back of the Nave. Simply follow the steps on screen to select your amount, and use your contactless debit or credit card, or ApplePay or Google Pay compatible device to complete the transaction.

If you're a UK tax-payer you can tell us through the Giving Station, and we'll be able to claim a further 25% of the value of your donation.

# Direct Giving by Standing Order

We're grateful for all donations, but if you'd like to make a regular donation you can complete a standing order form so that each week, month or year, your donation can be automatically processed by your bank. Please speak to a sidesperson, who will provide you with the relevant form and GiftAid declaration.
