Organ completed in 1918 and cases (negotiations on design commenced with Comper December 1937) added in 1938 by Hill, Norman & Beard. In 1976 Kenneth J Canter completed major repairs and in 2008 Kenneth Tickell & Co. Ltd., Northampton, carried out a complete cleaning and overhaul. Tubular pneumatic action was replaced with electro pneumatic action and pedal trombone added. Console sits on Rood Screen.
