We welcome you to our worshipping community at All Saints. Prayer and praise have been offered to God on this site since at least the ninth century, and since 1680 in this Church when it was built under the patronage of Charles II following the destruction of the old Church in the Great Fire of 1675. Our community is defined by its catholic faith, and orthodox doctrine and worship. We are evangelical in spiritual holiness, love and zeal, and apostolic in mission.

All Saints is proud to maintain traditional worship in the heart of this great town, and our worship is complimented by our vibrant music programme – one of the largest of its kind in England – with over one hundred musicians regularly offering their talents *solì Deo gloria*. Our Choir of Boys and Men, the last such choir in the Diocese, can be traced back over six hundred years; the statutes of 1388 make reference to ‘the organ player’ who was paid and housed in return for playing for services and ‘teaching children to sing’ – that tradition continues unchanged today.

Musical highlights for the coming term include no fewer than five concerts. On Friday 20 January at 7:00PM the Girls’ Choir perform *Britten’s Ceremony of Carols*, and are joined by the Choral Scholars and Lay Clerks for *Charpentier’s Messe de Minuit pour Noël*. The Director of Music continues his exploration of national organ music, visiting the Netherlands, Denmark, Belgium and Russia on the first Thursday of each month at 1:10PM. These lunchtime recitals are FREE, with the retiring collection supporting our programme of building maintenance, focusing especially on our windows.

During the half-term break the Boys’ Choir will be touring through Belgium, France, Denmark, Germany and the Netherlands. In advance of this they will be performing some of their tour repertoire at St Edmundsbury Cathedral on Saturday 14 January, including the first performance of our 2012 commission, the Third Service by *Michael Finnissy*. The music of *James MacMillan* and *Henry Purcell* features during services this term, in advance of a concert scheduled for May exploring these two great British composers, as does the music of *Herbert Howells*, in advance of our next CD recording.

This booklet lists all the services between Sunday 1 January and Friday 27 April. The next booklet begins on Saturday 28 April with the Service of Licensing at 3:00PM of *The Reverend Dr David McConkey* as our next Parish Priest. Our celebrations continue on Sunday 29 April when the Girls’ Choir’s latest CD, *Notre Père*, will be released. Please note that Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament will now be offered after the service of Choral Evensong at 6:00PM on the final Sunday of each month.

It is always the aim of the Churchwardens, Assistant Priests and the Director of Music that our services here should be dedicated to the glory of God. Our music is not an end in itself but part of a larger whole. We hope that in the singing and in the silence, in the spoken word and in the beauty of this house of God, you will feel that greater presence, and be blessed by the peace that passes all understanding.

¶ The Paschal Triduum.

The Paschal Triduum is the period of three days that begins with the Mass of the Lord's Supper on the evening of Maundy Thursday, reaches its climax at The Great Vigil and First Mass of Easter, and ends with Choral Evensong on Easter Day. These are the holiest days in the Church year, recalling the Last Supper and the passion, death, burial, and resurrection of Jesus. They are also the most wide-ranging and dramatic, moving from the great solemnities of Maundy Thursday and Good Friday to the outpouring of joy on Easter Saturday and Sunday. Before the Triduum begins we prepare in our forty-days of Lent, with our following of the Stations of the Cross on Fridays, and with *Tenebræ* – the service of shadows – on Wednesday in Holy Week

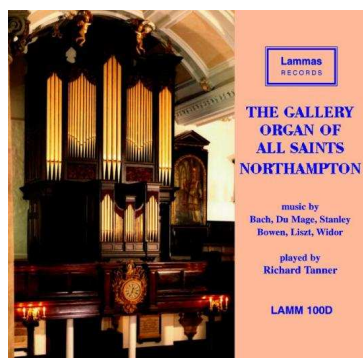
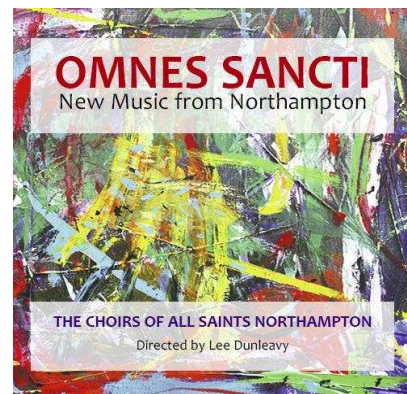
The Choirs of All Saints have six commercial recordings currently available from our website, with a seventh disc *Notre Père*, featuring French repertoire for upper voices, to be released on 29 April 2012. Two further recordings are available featuring our Gallery Organ. For more information please visit www.allsaintsnorthampton.co.uk.

Following the Girls' Choir's internationally-acclaimed disc of 2004, *En Prière*, their latest recording features a second recital of French sacred music for upper voices. **Notre Père** features no fewer than six first recordings, including works by *Grovez*, *Langlais*, *Litaize*, *Nivers* and *de Severac*. The most significant work on the disc is the charming and melodious *Messe pour deux voix égales*, one of the last works written by the female composer *Cécile Chaminade*.



Our fastest-selling disc, with over 700 copies sold since its release in November 2011, **Carol of Joy** is the third carol CD from the Choirs of All Saints, and features a fresh selection of your favourite carols. Highlights include the first commercial recording of two carols written for the choirs in 2010 by *Sir Richard Rodney Bennett*, as featured on BBC Radio 3, and arrangements by our Director of Music, Assistant Organists, and former organ scholar *Magnus Williamson*.

Released in November 2010, **Omnes Sancti** features the choirs in performances of thirteen of the most recent works commissioned by the choirs. The choirs combine to perform *Malcolm Archer's* dramatic double-organ *Missa Omnes Sancti*. Of particular interest is *James MacMillan's* staggering *Ave Maria*, written for the choirs in 2009, and *O soft self-wounding Pelican* by the pianist-composer *Stephen Hough*, who also produced the distinctive cover art.



Beginning with *J. S. Bach's* famous *Toccatà and Fugue in D minor*, this recital by former Director of Music *Richard Tanner* puts **The Gallery Organ of All Saints Northampton** through its paces. The CD also includes *Liszt's* epic *Fantasia and Fugue on B.A.C.H.*, smaller works by *Bach*, *du Mage*, *Stanley* and *York Bowen*, and concludes with a scintillating performance of the virtuosic *Final* from *Widor's Symphonie No. 6 in G minor*.
