We welcome you to our worshipping community at All Saints. Prayer and praise have been offered to God on this site since at least the ninth century, and since 1680 in this Church when it was built under the patronage of Charles II following the destruction of the old Church in the Great Fire of 1675.

The statutes of 1388 make reference to ‘the organ player’ who was paid and housed in return for playing for services and ‘teaching children to sing’; that tradition continues unchanged today. Our Boys’ Choir sings on Wednesdays, Fridays with the Choral Scholars, and on Sundays with the Choral Scholars and Lay Clerks. Our Girls’ Choir sings on Mondays and regularly leads our Sunday services. The All Saints’ Singers sing at the 12:30PM Mass on red letter days. Alterations to this pattern are noted in the booklet. With our Assistant Organists and Organ Scholars the music department numbers over one hundred musicians regularly leading our worship.

The term begins with the Girls and Men singing Evensong at St Paul’s Cathedral (Monday 5 September at 5:00PM), with an all American programme including music by *Morten Lauridsen*, *Bruce Neswick*, *Craig Phillips* and *David Ashley White*. The choirs give two concerts this term; on Friday 18 November at 7:00PM the Boys and Men give a concert performance of ‘Cathedral Classics’ – including works such as ‘Zadok the Priest’, ‘I was glad’ and ‘Blessed be the God and Father’, and on Friday 9 December at 7:00PM the Girls’ Choir perform *Britten’s* ‘A Ceremony of Carols’, alongside other seasonal favourites. Monthly organ recitals continue on the first Thursday of each month at 1:10PM, when the Director of Music takes the audience “around the world” – over this term visiting England, France, the United States and Germany.

Works marked with an asterisk * were composed for or commissioned by All Saints. This term we give the first performance of two works; on Sunday 6 November at 10:30AM ‘Ecce sacerdos magnus’ by *Professor John Caldwell*, and on Wednesday 16 November at 6:00PM, O Jesu, blessed Lord by *Humprey Clucas*. On Tuesday 1 November the Choirs launch their latest CD - Carol of Joy - recorded at the beginning of September in the glorious acoustic of St Mary’s Church in Wellingborough, after the 6:00PM Solemn Choral Mass with Procession.

It is always the aim of the Churchwardens, Assistant Priests and the Director of Music that our services here should be dedicated to the glory of God. Our music is not an end in itself but part of a larger whole. We hope that in the singing and in the silence, in the spoken word and in the beauty of this house of God, you will feel that greater presence, and be blessed by the peace that passes all understanding.

¶ *In many places the Feast of St Catherine (of the Wheel) was celebrated with the utmost solemnity, servile work being suppressed and the devotions being attended by great numbers of people. In several dioceses of France it was observed as a Holy Day of Obligation up to the beginning of the seventeenth century, the splendour of its ceremonial eclipsing that of the feasts of some of the Apostles. Our Parish includes the former Parish of St Katherine, the Church in her honour having been demolished in 1950, and she is pictured in one of two Ikons, the other in honour of St Peter, at the entrance to the Lady Chapel.*
