We welcome you to our worshipping community at All Saints. Prayer and praise have been offered to God on this site since at least the ninth century, and since 1680 in this Church when it was built under the patronage of Charles II following the destruction of the old Church in the Great Fire of 1675. This year's Oak Apple Day celebrations on Saturday 29 May will commemorate the 350th anniversary of the Restoration of the Monarchy, and we celebrate on the day with a service at 11:00AM.

The statutes of 1388 make reference to 'the organ player' who was paid and housed in return for playing for services and 'teaching children to sing'; that tradition continues unchanged today. Our Boys' Choir sings on Wednesdays, Fridays with the Choral Scholars, and on Sundays with the Choral Scholars and Lay Clerks. Our Girls' Choir sings on Mondays and regularly leads our Sunday services. The All Saints' Singers sing at the 12:30PM Eucharist on red letter days. Alterations to this pattern are noted in the booklet. With our Assistant Organists and Organ Scholars the music department numbers over one hundred musicians regularly leading our worship.

After years focusing on the anniversaries of *Elgar & Vaughan Williams* (2007 and 2008) and last year *Handel, Haydn, Purcell & Mendelssohn*, this year the choirs focus on works composed for them, marked in this booklet thus‡. On Sunday 13 June at 10:30AM the Girls and Men give the first performance of a Jubilate Deo in E by *Gordon Lawson* who will travel from his home in Spain to join us. On Sunday 27 June at 10:30AM the Boys' Choir perform the first of five motets, newly composed by our Director of Music, which are set bi-lingually in English and Danish for the Boys tour to Denmark this October. This emphasis on our commissions will reach its climax in July when the choirs record a CD of these works, and give the first performance our 2010 commission, "Ave Maria" by *Dr James MacMillan CBE*, and a further performance at Christ Church Cathedral, Dublin, as part of our Summer Tour.

The Director of Music's extremely popular recital series "Back to Bach" concludes on Thursday 6 May at 1:10PM. This summer's recital series – The Queen of Instruments – begins on Thursday 3 June at 1:10PM with a recital by *Dr Jennifer Bate OBE* – Patron of this series – featuring seven of the finest female organists working in Britain today. The year's recitals conclude on Thursday 22 July at 1:10PM when the Director of Music gives a 'requests' recital, performing works suggested to him last term.

It is always the aim of the Churchwardens, Honorary Assistant Priests and the Director of Music that our services here should be dedicated to the glory of God. Our music is not an end in itself but part of a larger whole. We hope that in the singing and in the silence, in the spoken word and in the beauty of this house of God, you will feel that greater presence, and be blessed by the peace that passes all understanding.
